WHO ARE THE MENTORS ?

Mentors represent one of the most important components of these events.

These are the subject matter experts who provide guidance to the coding teams during the hackathon.

There are conservation mentors and technology mentors.

The conservation mentors will be available during the event to discuss the trafficking and conservation issues for the teams, and answer their questions in real time.

Conservation mentors can help the teams focus on a feasible approach or find key issues related to their problem statements, including making use of publicly available conservation data sets.

Technology mentors will be available during the event to discuss the coding itself, the choice of interface, the best coding languages or tech for what they want to develop, to offer tips and approaches to actually developing their wireframe solutions.

Tech mentors can discuss or offer examples of similar technology or algorithms that perform the types of tasks that they envision their demo tech performing.

Both sets of mentors can also make a demonstration either via pre-recorded or live video, including on preparing their final presentations for the judges.

WHEN DO THE MENTORS DO THEIR WORK ?

The different mentors will coordinate with the event organizers in order to be online, in shifts of 3-4 hour each on Saturday 7th and 1-2 hours each on Sunday 8th, and only during some specified shifts.

HOW DO THE MENTORS COMMUNICATE WITH THE TEAMS ?

Designated Slack will be made available for the mentors to answer questions and communicate with the various participating teams, and separately with the event organizers.
